THE GOALS

- Assist in the removal of seized aircraft from the active runway.
- Disrupt the use of La Aurora airport by the drug trafficking organizations by enforcing U.S. regulations on N numbered planes.
- Provide training for counterparts to improve there investigative skills.

The benefits of conducting International Operations

- Improve security and to ensure that the airspace is safe.
- Increase tax revenue by ensuring planes are properly registered in host country
- Identify individuals involved in illegal activity.
- Improve communication with host countries.
- Improve information sharing on aircraft registration.
- Assist in the development of aviation laws and policies.
- Assisting in ICAO compliance

Operation Boneyard Statistics

- Total Number of Operations: 3
- Total Number of US Registered Aircraft Inspected: 122
- Total Number of US Registered Aircraft found to have Safety Violations: 51
- Total Number of US Registered Aircraft found with Registration Issues: 35 Note...many others have either registered in Guatemala or in a trust
- Total Number of Aircraft Seized: 12 (8 in Guatemala 4 in the US)
- ION narcotic hits: 4 positive results
- Arrests: 9

Total Value: \$5,680,000.00
